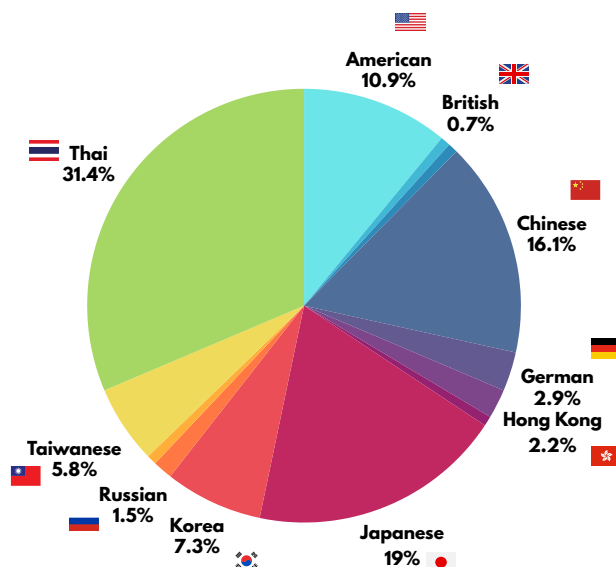
ABOUT ISE

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ISE PRE-KINDERGARTEN

In Pre-Kindergarten, We follow the Reggio Emilia Approach, an educational philosophy which believes that children are strong individuals who can be active members of the community and who can construct their own learning. This approach is based on the image of the child as someone who possesses strong potentialities and who learns and grows in relationship with others. We believe that children are with a hundred languages, through which they can express their ideas. Materials in our classroom are intentionally arranged. Children are exposed to meaningful learning experiences that encourage them to wonder, to inquire, to investigate, to explore, and to be problem solvers. Our inquiry units explore transdisciplinary themes to create meaningful learning through Literacy, Mathematics, Sciences, Social Studies, Thai Language and Culture, Physical Education, Visual Arts and Music.

ISE ELEMENTARY

ISE Elementary uses the American Education Reaches Out (AERO) standards as a framework for our curriculum. AERO standards are research-based and have been developed and implemented in international schools. Students will be learning and assessed through an inquiry-based learning approach, while meeting the AERO standards. Students in grades Kindergarten through Grade 5 develop essential skills to become lifelong learners. Learning at ISE focuses on developing each child’s: Social-emotional development at ISE builds key skills in communication, social interaction, self-management, research, and thinking. Students explore concepts and apply their learning to real-world challenges, guided by the United Nations Sustainable Development Goals.

CURRICULUM AND GRADUATION REQUIREMENTS

ISE offers a rigorous American-style curriculum from Kindergarten through Grade 12, built on the AERO (American Education Reaches Out) standards to ensure consistency, quality, and alignment with best practices in international education. In Grades 11–12, students have the option to pursue the full International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP). All instructional programs are designed to prepare students for global post-secondary pathways and are aligned with ISE’s mission, WASC accreditation expectations, and IB requirements.

GRADING SYSTEMS

ISE employs a traditional A–F letter grading scale to assess student achievement in Grades 6–12. Semester grades are calculated from a combination of formative and summative assessments, with grade point averages (GPA) reported on a 4.0 scale.

In Grades 11–12, students enrolled in the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme (IBDP) receive official IB marks (1–7) to reflect their progress toward diploma requirements. Report cards are issued twice per year, with mid-semester progress reports provided to ensure ongoing communication and support. These assessments help students, teachers, and parents monitor academic growth and ensure each learner stays on track to achieve success.

ABOUT IB AT ISE

The International Baccalaureate (IB) at ISE gives our students both access to global universities and the chance to shape a challenging program that still reflects who they are. The IB is designed around six subject groups with a central core—Theory of Knowledge (TOK), the Extended Essay, and CAS—that connect directly to ISE’s mission of preparing students for future success, lifelong learning, and global responsibility within a supportive community.

Students entering grade 11 will make 6 subject choices.

General guidelines for the choices are:

1. Choose one course from each of the following groups (*Group 1, Group 3, Group 4 and Group 5*).
2. Choose a second language course from either Group 1 or Group 2.
3. Choose a sixth course from one of the following options:
 - a third language course
 - a second course from either Group 3 or Group 4
 - a course from The Arts, group 6.
4. Normally, three subjects (and not more than four) are taken at higher level (HL), and the others are taken at standard level (SL). The IB recommends 240 teaching hours for HL subjects and 150 hours for SL. Subjects at HL are studied in greater depth and breadth than at SL.
